Location

- Carson City, Nevada is the Capital of Nevada.
- Geographically it is located 30 minutes south of Reno, Nevada and 30 minutes east of Lake Tahoe.
- Carson City is located in the heart of the historic gold rush area and only minutes from Virginia City.
- The area features abundant outdoor recreation: hunting, fishing, golf, water sports, and snow sports.
- The area has excellent local restaurants and major shopping centers.
- There is diverse indoor entertainment and casinos in Carson City, Reno, and Lake Tahoe.
- The area also features great family vacation spots.

Facility

- The Nationals would be held at Carson High School, the same location that held the 2005 Sieger show.
- The facility is ideally set up for events with lights, bleachers, and ample paved parking.
- The primary field for the event is a fully fenced outdoor soccer field.
- There are additional fields for exercise and practice.
- The facility would have onsite concessionaires.

Tracking

- Carson City is only 30 minutes from the Carson Valley agriculture area. The area is home to numerous large ranches and operating farms.
- The Carson Valley is one of the earliest-settled, richest, and most productive of the state's agricultural regions. In spring, summer, and autumn, when the valley is bursting with life, the vast irrigated tracts are a green velvet patchwork quilt upon which the stacks of baled hay stand like giant cheese, and cottonwoods and poplars rise up like flashing green flames. The meadows are sopped with water from the Sierra, fat and languid cattle browse placidly everywhere.
- There are several different tracking surfaces available including pastures, planted fields, and plowed fields.
- The agriculture areas of Fallon and Yerington are also nearby allowing us to choose the best possible tracking areas.

Accommodations

- We are fortunate enough to have secured two excellent hotels located side by side in Carson City for the show.
- The first is a premium suite hotel that will be the primary non-dog hotel (no dogs in rooms).
- The second hotel also a premium hotel and it will be the primary dog friendly hotel.
- Both hotels have been built in the last year and offer the latest amenities. Both offer a full breakfast, ample lighted outdoor parking, room to exercise the dogs, and direct access to the new freeway which ends at the main street located near the High School and are just minutes from the field.
- There are several good quality motels in the area that are dog friendly that will serve as overflow properties if necessary.

Travel

- **The area is served by three major highways, US395, Interstate 80, and Highway 50 connecting Carson City from Los Angeles to Vancouver, and San Francisco to New York.**
- **Reno International Airport is served by all major airlines. All the dog friendly airlines fly full size jets that can accommodate large crates including: United, Northwest, Continental, Delta, Frontier, American and Alaska. There are direct connections to many major cities throughout the US.**
- **Reno is a year round tourist destination and every major rental car agency has a facility onsite at the airport. Because of the outdoor recreation available in the area all the rental companies are well equipped with vans and SUVs.**
- **There are several other major airports all located within a reasonable drive.**
 - **San Francisco International airport is a major hub for direct flights from Europe and the Far East. The airport is an easy 3 and ½ hour drive from Reno over the scenic Sierra Nevada mountains on Interstate 80.**
 - **Sacramento International Airport is located just two hours from Reno on the Interstate 80 corridor.**
 - **In addition San Jose International and Oakland International airport are all within driving distance of Carson City.**

Experience

- Blue Tahoe Schutzhund Club was the local club for the 1999 and 2003 USA Nationals.
- Both Nationals had some the largest competitor entries USA has ever had.
- We were also the local host club for the 2005 Sieger show.
- We have hosted several regional events.
- The club has been in existence for 11 years and has a hard working and dedicated membership.
